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New Sustaining Member: Thomas L. Faul Assoc., Inc.

Thomas L. Faul Associates, Inc., was founded in 1959 in Skaneateles, N. Y. In 1962 they moved to Auburn, N. Y., shortly after incorporation. The company has specialized in precision engineering connected with both moderate and high-accuracy coordinate drafting equipment.

In 1962 the company received the exclusive rights for the manufacture, sale, and distribution under license of products manufactured by Coradi Ag. of Zurich, a famous Swiss instrument maker well-known for their high-precision mathematical instruments, planimeters, coordinatographs, pantographs, and integrators. In cooperation with Coradi, Faul Assoc. further developed the manual, semi-automatic, and fully automatic plotting coradographs and coradomats to a high degree, incorporating American concepts and ideas in the basically developed Swiss equipment. The

combination has resulted in a wide range of manual coradographs up to a work area of 79 by 52 inches.

These machines are available with semi-automatic equipment of American design, enabling the manual units to readout in X, Y, Z-coordinates, and thus providing an automatic readout system for stereo plotters of many different varieties.

Fully automatic coradomats have also been developed by Coradi and Faul and are available with electronics reaching to the most sophisticated techniques known today, including drafting with a light beam on photo-sensitive materials.

As a result of similar arrangements with the Nestler firm of Lahy/Schwarzwald, West Germany, a completely new drafting machine and table has been designed and is now being distributed.
