The International Geographic Information Foundation (IGIF) continues to administer the awards listed below on behalf of the American Society of Photogrammetry and Remote Sensing Awards Program.

The William A. Fisher Memorial Scholarship
The V Talbert Abrams Award
The Brock Gold Medal Award
The Robert E. Altenhofen Memorial Scholarship
The Ta Liang Memorial Award
The Analytical Surveys Photogrammetric Scholarship
The John I. Davidson President's Award for Practical Papers

These principal Award Funds are on deposit in restricted investment accounts and generate sufficient interest to support the annual award with few exceptions. The exceptions continue to challenge the Foundation.

The Foundation is continuing its efforts to complete arrangements for the publication of two manuscripts now in the final editing

process. Lack of interest in a proposed Review Board has caused the Trustees to drop this project.

The immediate Past Presidents of ASPRS and ACSM continue to serve one-year terms as Trustees of the Foundation. The ACSM Board of Directors have agreed to join IGIF. The formalization of this agreement should be completed with the response of the Trustees to the last inquiry from the Executive Director of ACSM. In this response, ACSM has been asked to appoint two members to the IGIF Board in addition to the Past President's position.

The 1989 Auction was not as successful as the one in 1988. Our current experience indicates that additional planning will be required for the 1990 event.

By action of the Trustees the IGIF has awarded \$3,000 to the ASPRS Building Fund. One thousand dollars will be given immediately, and two additional payments of \$1,000 will be made early in 1990 and 1991.

The primary purpose of the IGIF continues to be raising and administering funding to assist ASPRS, ACSM, and other organizations in the surveying

and mapping sciences in establishing and maintaining scholarship and awards programs.
